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"American Idol" Abi Carter presents \$20,000 check to Tools For Tomorrow




Thank you for your ongoing support of and dedication to Tools For Tomorrow.

Tools For Tomorrow continues our partnership as an Expanded Learning Opportunity Program partner with Desert Sands and Palm Springs Unified School Districts. We have focused our branding as the Creative Club from Tools For Tomorrow to help students and families better understand our program. The Creative

Club will be at nine Desert Sands schools and fifteen Palm Springs schools. In addition, we are excited to offer a unique theatre experience in both school districts this year. We have a Theatre Troupe at Rio Vista Elementary School in the Fall and at Harry S. Truman Elementary in the Spring. We have continued and expanded our partnership with the Boys & Girls Club of Cathedral City with a summer program and now a full-year Creative Club. Our teaching artists continue to be engaged, innovative, and focused on helping students explore their creative potential.

I am so impressed by the energy and caring effort of all the staff, volunteers, board members, and VISIONARIES. I am proud to be a part of such an amazing team that works to bring the arts to children.

VOLUNTEERS IN THE CLASSROOM

Volunteers for the Creative Club are an important part of our success. Volunteers help the teaching artist by working one-on-one with students as they create their projects and assisting with set-up and clean-up. Volunteers for the Theatre Troupe help students embrace acting by learning their lines and playing theatre games to develop their focus.



EMILY CULHAN PRESENTS MUSIC-BASED UNIT AT CAEA CURRICULUM SLAM

After attending the National Art Education Association Conference in Minneapolis, MN, Emily was invited to present "The Planets" at the California State Conference. Inspired by Gustav Holst's seven-movement orchestral suite, the lesson integrates the visual arts, music, and science in a multi-sensory arts experience. Students listen and respond to



the music and learn about the solar system while creating an outer space background using oil pastels. They then draw a rocket ship incorporating pattern and color, cut it out, and glue their ship to their background. Being an astronaut is a top-five dream career for children 8-12 years old. Learning about space inspires ideas about adventure and mystery.



CV WATERCOLOR SOCIETY PROVIDES PAPER, PAINT, PENCILS & BRUSHES



Teaching Artist Sara Waters led students in an abstract art activity based on Wassily Kandinsky. Students listened to a story about him, looked at his works of art, and created a painting in his style. Students discussed

how colors can reflect our feelings and elicit an emotional response to a work of art. They used their watercolor pan paints to add color to their abstract drawing thinking about how they felt and who they wanted the painting to be about. They learned how

to mix colors and use their paints. Teaching Artist Piper Scott introduced students to watercolor pencils and their versatility by drawing and painting a bird. Students were so excited by the unique way to create art. They are so proud of their paintings!

Each student in our Creative Club receives their own set of art supplies to use during our program and keep at the end so they can continue their creativity at home. Art kits include oil pastels, watercolor paints, crayons, markers, a sketch book, and more!

We are constantly assembling art kits and could not do this without the wonderful dedication of our Board Members and Volunteers. For the fall session, 308 art kits were created. This means that volunteers organized 4,928 markers as well as 3,696 oil pastels and watercolor pencils! **THANK YOU to the TFT Board Members and Volunteers who help assemble**art kits.

Teaching Artists - Training and Team Building

We have an amazing group of 12 Teaching Artists and 2 Teaching Assistants for the fall session. All of our Teaching Artists and Assistants participated in at least one of the teacher training and orientation sessions that took place on August 13 and 20, 2024. We reviewed logistics and classroom management, went over new lessons, and experimented with new materials such as musical Boomwhackers and gel printmaking. Teaching Artists continue to meet in between sessions to share classroom experiences and collaborate on lesson plans.





CHILDREN'S BOOKS SPARK CREATIVITY AND PROMOTE LITERACY

This year, TFT introduced children's literature books into our curriculum. The books are read in TFT's Creative Clubs, the children create related art and music projects and then take the books home to share with siblings.

Children's books can engage a child, facilitating their wonder, curiosity and interests. Introducing children to books paired with music and hands-on art projects encourages them to become readers and storytellers, building skills, confidence and understanding for English Language Learners.

Children's books allow students to learn about important people, discover perseverance as they see themselves reflected in stories of overcoming adversity, feel empowered to express themselves and be inspired by the beautiful illustrations.









THE JOY OF MUSIC WITH BOOMWHACKERS

Boomwhackers promote fun and learning simultaneously with an engaging musical experience. Bright, lightweight, hollow, color-coded, plastic tubes, Boomwhackers are tuned to a musical pitch by length and are labeled with the musical note they produce. Boomwhackers can be used to teach melodies, chords, and rhythms. They are also a natural energizer and stress reliever. Playing Boomwhackers is a group activity, encouraging collaboration and listening skills. Hitting the tubes requires precision and timing, helping children develop fine and gross motor skills.
